IOLS: Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills

Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS) is the next step in adult leader training after completing Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training and expands the knowledge and content already introduced. Its purpose is to adequately prepare unit leadership to carry out outdoor activities safely and effectively.

Specifically, this hands-on program gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a Scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.

<u>Practical, Hands-On Component Course Schedule, Fee, Registration</u>

Cost per participant: \$40

The course is open to all adult Scouters registered in Scouting. The IOLS course will begin at 6:00 p.m. Friday, January 31st and end by 5:00 p.m on Saturday, February 1st. The course fee includes training materials, "Trained" patch, and food (Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner). Participants should eat dinner before arriving Friday night. To allow time for ordering materials and food, the course registration will close at noon on Friday, January 24, 2025.

Participants will camp in a regular campsite at Camp Horne using the Adirondacks or they may bring their own tent.
